To the editors,

In 2017 Prof. Jerry Nolan (current chair of the European Resuscitation Council), and Dr. Clare Morden (current chair of the ‘Young ERC’) founded the ‘Young ERC’. Since then the ‘Young ERC’ met twice at the annual Resuscitation conferences 2018 in Bologna, Italy and 2019 in Ljubljana, Slovenia. Additional efforts to mentor the youth within the European Resuscitation Council are currently available in the form of the ERC ResearchNET and the annual young investigator competition. The ‘Young ERC’ aims to enable young resuscitation enthusiasts throughout the world to network and share experiences, ideas and opportunities by providing mentoring, education and a social platform. The ultimate goal is to engage the next generation of doctors, nurses, medical students and Emergency Medical Services personnel in shaping the future of the European Resuscitation Council. An additional goal of the ‘Young ERC’ is to bring together the current possibilities for young resuscitation enthusiasts within

the European Resuscitation Council. In September 2019, the 'Young ERC' held an election at the Resuscitation conference for the new board members for the period 2020-2022, special representatives were also included in the election. Table 1 shows the current board of the 'Young ERC'.

So far, the 'Young ERC' members had the opportunity to partake first-hand in interesting tasks (e.g. poster tour co-chairing) at the Resuscitation conferences 2018 and 2019. This was perceived as being highly helpful in developing one's own network and sharing experiences with 'Young ERC' members paired with senior advisors. During the 2019 Resuscitation conference an informal get-together was held in Ljubljana, Slovenia. In the year 2020, the 'Young ERC' intends to expand their presence at the Resuscitation conference and is currently seeking opportunities to engage in specific tasks (such as co-chairing of the resuscitation competition, collaboration with the ERC ResearchNet, expanding the online presence, a new quarterly newsletter etc.).
