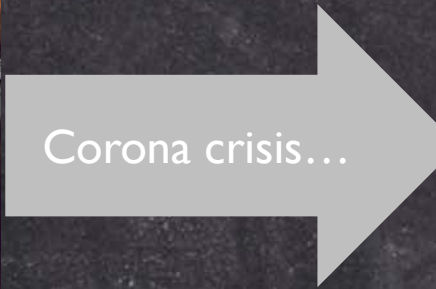

FACE TO FACE

- Keynote discussions (roundtable with audience interaction)
- Evening Keynote with apéro
- --

VIRTUAL FORMAT

- Keynote discussions (pre-recorded videos; in the live session: only key statements, then moderated Q&As)
- Live Evening Keynote, followed by random breakout rooms for online apéro
- Covid-19 Roundtable with several stakeholders

FACE TO FACE

- Solution Rooms with “next practices” (facilitated)
- Co-Creative Labs: freely designable spaces
- Poster Market with space for discussions
- Speed-dating / Partnership market

VIRTUAL FORMAT

- Solution Rooms with “next practices” (facilitators and presenters met in advance and tested what they needed)
- Co-Creative Labs: (moderators were given access to their virtual room well in advance to try out what they wanted; many software solutions used)
- Poster Plaza: same template, all posters available in advance, 60 sec key message, then break-out rooms in groups of 4 posters
- Book an expert

FACE TO FACE

- Network meetings as side events
- Excursions to sustainability initiatives in Bern
- Harvesting and Visual summary

VIRTUAL FORMAT

- Online network meetings as lunch events
- Virtual excursion: 5 filmed stories featuring members of sustainability initiative in Bern pre-recorded; group discussion in break-out rooms after watching the video together
- Harvesting and Visual Summary: “Murals” for harvesting feedback from moderators + facilitators + participants; presentation based on feedback, then explanation of Visual summary

Address the need for normative and technical guidance in sustainability accounting education while considering the importance of the dynamic practical field.

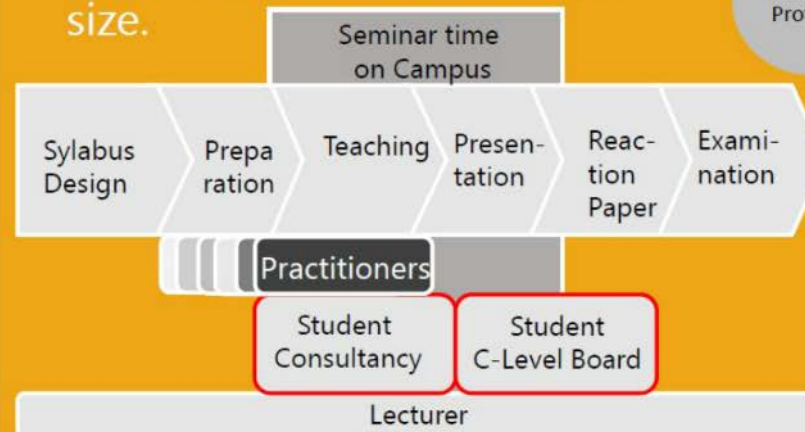
METHODS

2 Transdisciplinary sustainability accounting education draws on new expertise of practitioners to gain **technical and ethical knowledge** for interdisciplinary accounting students of any class size.

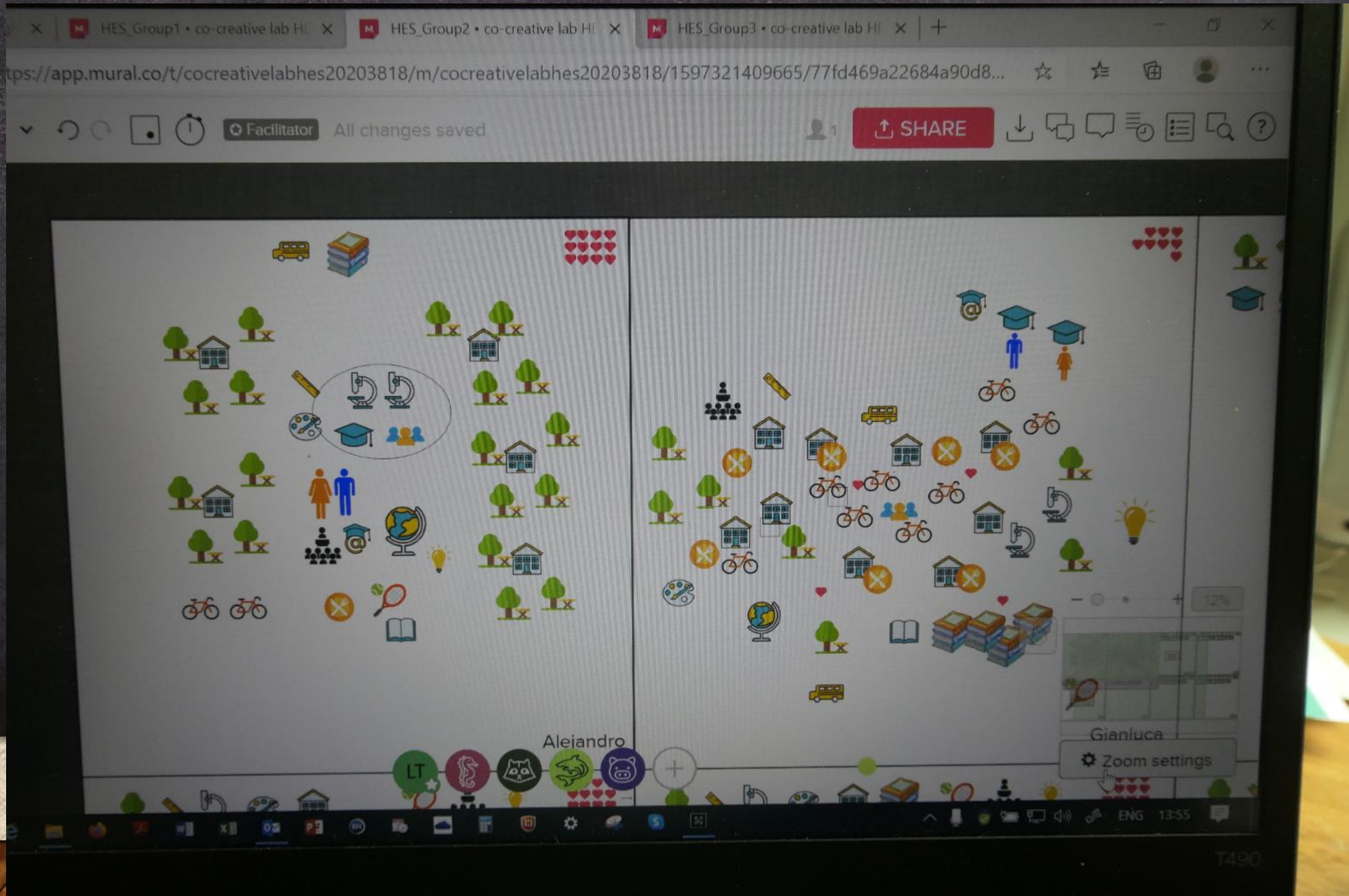

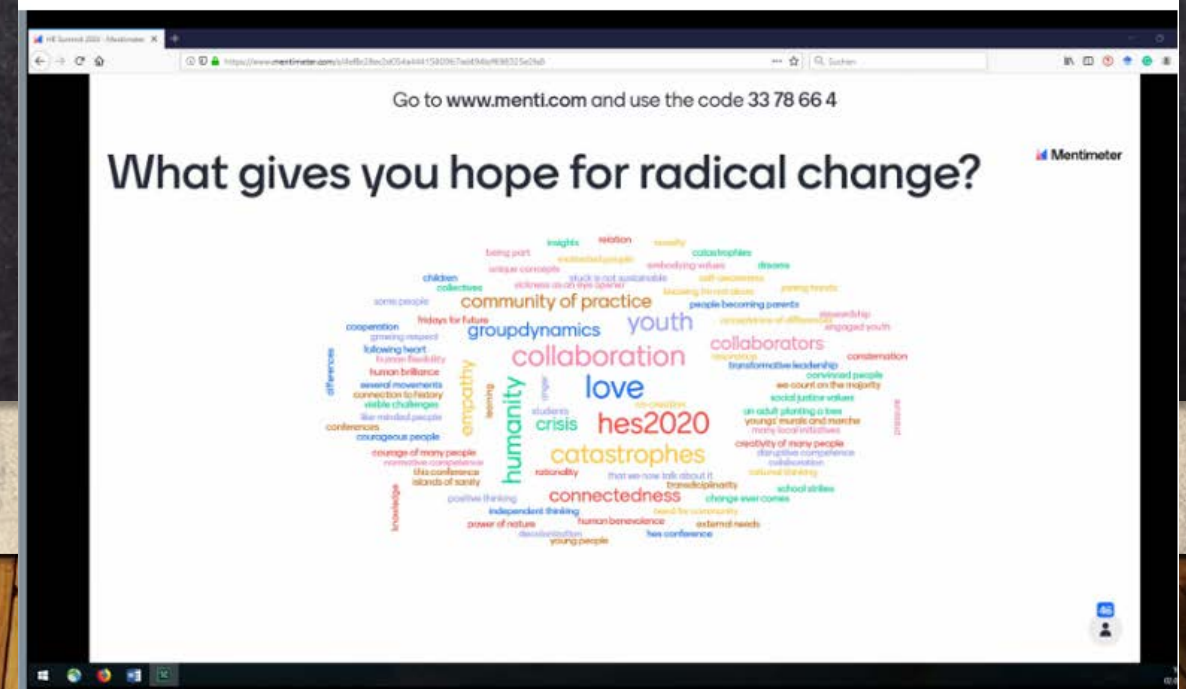
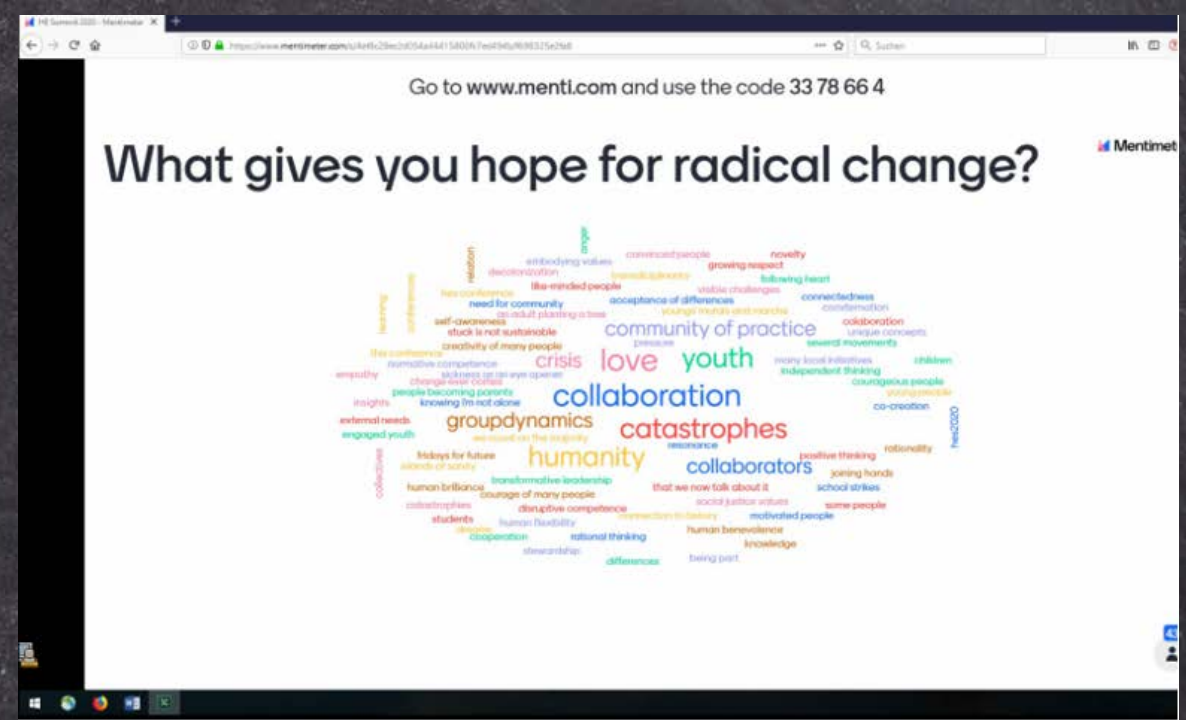

Post-conference survey: a large number of participants agreed that trust was built during the conference



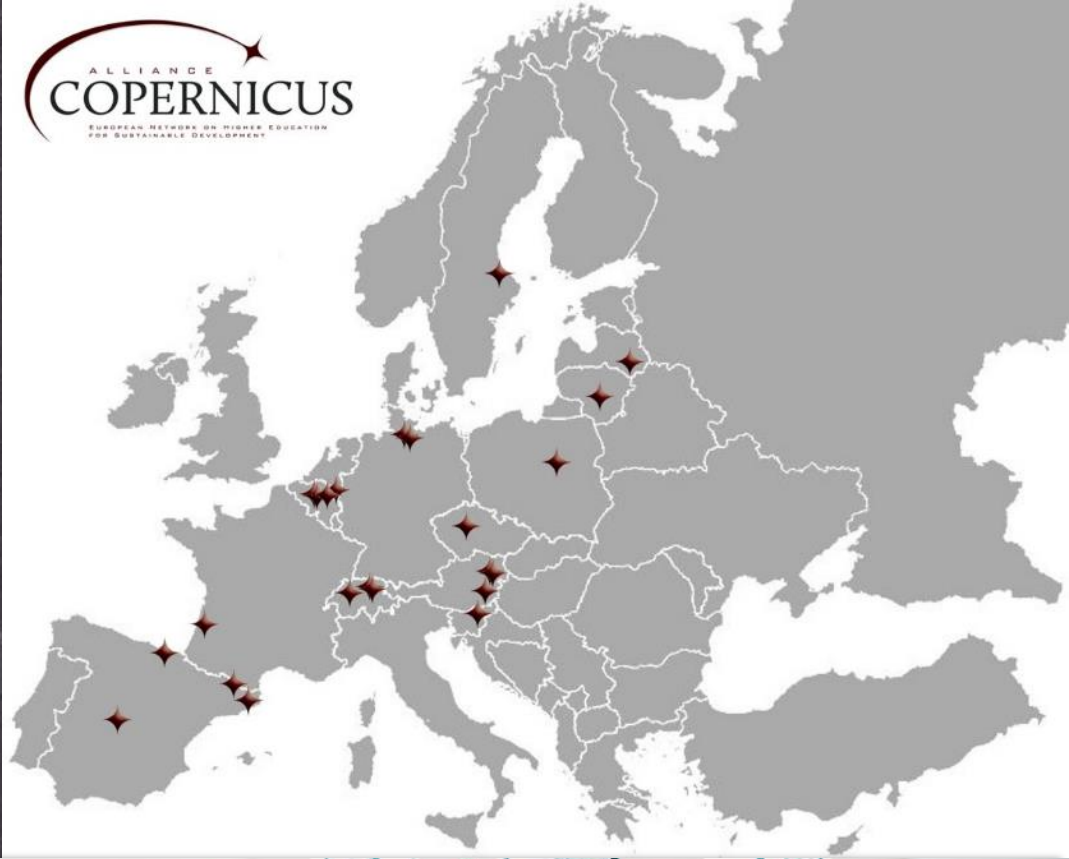
