#### Finance

- Financing alternative funding models such as the OBC and Opening the Future
- Funding single OA Gold BPCs or BCPCs through institutional OA Funds

### Infrastructure

 Offering institutional book publishing platforms such as Bern Open Publishing's <u>BOP Books</u>

- Issue of financing bookproduction

- Scholar-led
- Quality control (peer-review)

- CC Licenses
