Investigating artificial islands and lakeside sites 8000-800 BC

Context: This workshop seeks to bring together researchers working on the archaeology of early artificial islands, pile dwellings and lakeside sites across Europe. The day has been set up as an opportunity to share knowledge from recent projects with regards to understanding the breadth of the record, and also the means and modes of investigation. It stems from the work we have been doing on Neolithic crannogs in the Outer Hebrides as part of the 'Islands of Stone' project (<u>https://crannogs.soton.ac.uk</u>). As a result, we have come to recognise the richness and complexity of these sites, but also the challenges inherent in their investigation. The tone of the day will be informal, with presenters encouraged to talk about their recent work and findings, as well as critical challenges and questions for future research. Talks should be 20 minutes, with 10 minutes for questions.
