


## Amphorae of the Brindisi area in the *Gallia Belgica*: The example of Titelberg (LUX)

Excavations (2003-2008) on the Oppidum of Titelberg yielded a high density of structures, which seem to belong to a trading centre dating from the second half of the first century BC. The amphorae are being currently studied at the Institute of Archaeological Sciences at the University of Berne (CH). Nearly 1'200 amphorae could be registered.

In a few of the oldest structures, a little number of sherds with a compact reddish clay and white, often fine tempering were registered. Only after in-depth studies, the origin of this fabric could be located in the region of Brindisi. The studies were partially financed by the *Centre National de Recherche Archéologique* of Luxemburg. The publication of the trading centre is foreseen for 2017.
